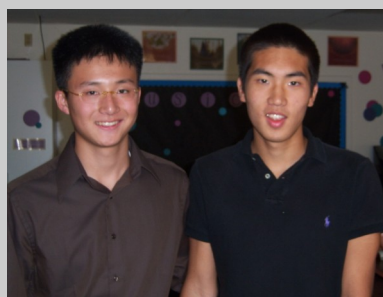

- Trips and activities

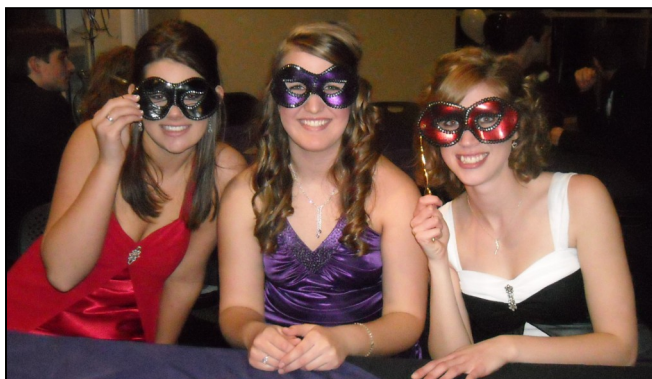
